



Rhyming Shapes

Can you think of rhymes to go into the shapes on this page? Say the word on each shape and think of as many rhyming words as you can. Write them inside the shapes.

Extension: Make your own rhyming dictionary. Divide the pages of a notebook and allow two to four pages for each letter of the alphabet (you may prefer to use only one page for such letters as “x” or “u”). Begin by choosing a word to represent each letter of the alphabet: A-Act, B-Bat, C-Cat, etc. Then, on each page, make as many rhymes as you can with the word on the page. Write them in alphabetical order, for example: Bat—at, bat, cat, fat, flat, hat, mat, pat, rat, sat, splat, vat, etc. Once you get the hang of it, try to find rhymes for more challenging words such as banana or aquarium.
